Shopping for an Android Tablet

To use an Android tablet to program an ajet 101 that is equipped with a Bluetooth adaptor you need an Android tablet that has Bluetooth functionality. We tested the system with a Nexus 7 which cost \$200 but sales tax and shipping drove up the price somewhat.

The Nexus worked well but I decided to do a search of the internet to check out what else was available. The search was done in May, 2013 and is in no way complete.

First it is important to note that most tablets do **NOT** have Bluetooth. They are not rare but unfortunately it does not seem to be a feature that can be found in broad internet searches; you have to check out the specs of the tablets one by one. I would recommend picking one with Android Version 4.0 or higher and with Google Play market app installed (most do, not all). Other than that would depend if you will have other uses for the tablet.

I first checked the site DX extreme(dx.com) in China. Shipping is free but expect to wait 5 or 6 weeks to get your purchase. They had over 700 models listed on their site. I searched the price range of \$100 to \$200 and found 40 models with Bluetooth.

Walmart had more than 100 models. I found six with Bluetooth.

Amazon was not organized in a way to easily find what I wanted but I did locate three.

There are, of course, many other sources.
